Safety Tips

Protect personal belongings

⌘ Place purses, bags and other personal belongings in the trunk of your car prior to arriving at the park, mall or other public place. Thefts have occurred after people were observed placing items in their trunks or hiding their keys.

⌘ Do not leave valuables where they can be seen through car windows.

⌘ Do not leave mail or other identifying documents in your vehicle.

⌘ It's best to leave valuables at home and bring only what you need and will carry on your person.

⌘ Park in high traffic areas whenever possible.

⌘ Lock your vehicle and make sure the windows are up.

⌘ Report suspicious persons or vehicles to a ranger- get a driver's license number.

⌘ Hancock Park District Rangers enforce the following regulations pertaining to dogs: Dogs must be on a leash no longer than 6 feet and under their handler's control at all times.



⌘ Dog walkers are responsible for cleaning up after their pets. Bags are available for your convenience at a variety of park locations including Litzenberg Memorial Woods, Riverbend Recreation Area and Riverside Park.

⌘ K-9 Field of Dreams Dog Park permits are available through the HPD office located at 1424 East Main Cross Street, Findlay. Current shot records and a \$10 fee are required to obtain a permit. Forms may also be downloaded at from the website.
