Request to hunt waterfowl at Oakwoods Nature Preserve: At the October 9, 2018 meeting, the Board considered a request to hunt waterfowl in the fields at Oakwoods Nature Preserve. The Board chose to hold on the request until the current farmland lease was over with the understanding that the issue could be revisited at that time.

Subsequent action by the Board led to the discontinuation of farming at Oakwoods Nature Preserve in favor of natural area development, approval of conceptual plans for a Wetland Restoration Project, and the submittal of H2Ohio grant applications for the development of wetland habitat, prairie habitat, and woodland habitat. In January 2020, the Board approved the H2Ohio Grant Agreement between the Hancock Park District and the Ohio Department of Natural Resources for the Wetland Restoration Project at Oakwoods Nature Preserve.

At the July 2021 Board meeting, a request was made to hunt waterfowl in the Wetland Restoration Area at Oakwoods Nature Preserve. Before the Board permits hunting at Oakwoods Nature Preserve, it should consider the following:

- 1. The Wetland Restoration Area is currently closed. The project will not be finished until December 2021 (tree planting is scheduled for autumn). Therefore, the earliest that hunting should be permitted is autumn of 2022.
- 2. Immediately upon completion of the Wetland Restoration Project, the Hancock Park District and the Ohio Department of Natural Resources will mutually agree upon an Environmental Covenant subjecting the property in perpetuity to activity and use limitations sufficient to protect the project and all wetlands created, restored, or maintained.
- 3. If hunting is permitted, it should be part of the Hancock Park District's Hunting with Permission Game Management Program. It should be subject to the annual hunting lottery, rules, and guidelines. Note: Ten permits are issued each year for waterfowl hunting at Litzenberg Memorial Woods.
- 4. If Oakwoods Nature Preserve is added to the hunting lottery, the park should be closed when hunting occurs. To do otherwise would create an unsafe environment.
- 5. Oakwoods Nature Preserve lacks the characteristics that make the south side of Litzenberg Memorial Woods a favorable hunting location. Compared to Litzenberg Memorial Woods, logistically, it would be more challenging to close Oakwoods Nature Preserve to the general public and permit hunting. Oakwoods Nature Preserve is already a popular destination. It is not difficult to foresee user conflicts and public relation challenges if the park is closed for hunting.

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Request to approve Resolution 2021-19 regarding additional appropriation within the Auditor's Certification and Park Commissioners to appropriate in the General Fund in the amount of \$1,500.00 for Auditor/Treasurer settlement fees: There was an increase in the Auditor/Treasurer fees, which are based on a percentage of taxes collected. That percentage increases every year. This year there was also a large company that is appealing its value to the state, which has caused the delinquent tax collection fees to rise (see Resolution 2021-19).

Request to approve Resolution 2021-20 accepting the amounts and rates as determined by the Budget Commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the County Auditor: Resolution 2021-20 accepts the amounts

and rates as determined by the Hancock County Budget Commission and authorizes the necessary tax levies and certifies them to the Hancock County Auditor for fiscal year commencing January 1, 2022. As a routine matter each year, the Board of Park Commissioners is required to accept and adopt the resolution (see Resolution 2021-20).

Request to approve Resolution 2021-21 regarding additional appropriation within the Auditor's Certification and Park Commissioners to appropriate in the General Fund in the amount of \$176,305.00 for design and engineering services associated with the Bright Conservation Area Wetland Restoration Project: The Hancock Park District issued a Request for Qualifications on December 13, 2019 and received Statements of Qualifications (SOQs) from qualified environmental firms on January 3, 2020. Coldwater Consulting, LLC was selected to complete all site assessment, conceptual design, cost estimating, surveying, permitting, design, and construction oversight activities. Coldwater Consulting, LLC provided professional services for the Wetland Restoration Area at Oakwoods Nature Preserve and has also been selected to provide the same services for the Bright Conservation Area Wetland Restoration Project.

The project timeline is as follows:

- Engineering and Design
 October 2021-March 2022
- Construction Process April 2022-December 2022

An agreement between the Hancock Park District and the Ohio Department of Natural Resources was executed on August 29, 2021. An H2Ohio grant in the amount of \$439,000.00 has been awarded. It is a 100% reimbursable grant. Engineering costs and construction costs are eligible and are included in the \$439,000.00 grant.

The Ohio Department of Natural Resources processed a purchase order in the amount of \$439,000.00 on September 2, 2021. A copy of the purchase order was given to the Hancock Park District with a message saying that the project can now begin.

An agreement for professional services between the Hancock Park District and Coldwater Consulting, LLC will be executed following Board approval of Resolution 2021-21. The agreement includes a fee for professional services in the amount of \$176,305.00 (see Resolution 2021-21).

DISCUSSION

Hancock Park District Report:

The Hancock Park District Director will be attending the virtual National Recreation and Park Association Annual Conference on September 21-23. The Director and Natural Resource Manager along with Kristen Risch from Coldwater Consulting will host a tour of the Wetland Restoration Area at Oakwoods Nature Preserve. Representatives from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources and prospective H2Ohio project participants will be in attendance to see an actual H2Ohio project and learn how a project goes from start to finish. Stevie Brooks was hired at Park Manager East. She will begin work on September 27.

Budget development is underway. History Comes Alive is next week. Pioneer Tyke Hikes and Autumnfest are scheduled for the fall. Zonta Landing Boat Rental revenue was \$6,500.00; not as much as 2020 but more than 2019. Fall Float Trips are available on weekends from September through mid-November. Drone photographs were taken of the Wetland Restoration Area on August 25, 2021.
